MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MoU)

Between

Stella Mary's College of Engineering

Aruthenganvilai, Kanyakumari District, Tamil Nadu

And

Shri Vaari Electricals Private Limited

Chennai, Tamil Nadu

Date of Execution: 10th June, 2026

1. Preamble

This Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) is entered into on the date mentioned above between:

1.1 Stella Mary's College of Engineering (SMCE), an autonomous institution established in 2012 by the Nova Educational Trust, located at Azhikal, Aruthenganvilai, Kanyakumari District, Tamil Nadu. The College is accredited by NAAC and holds NBA accreditation for its BE programs in Computer Science & Engineering and Mechanical Engineering. SMCE is committed to providing quality technical education, fostering research, and developing ethically responsible professionals.

1.2 Shri Vaari Electricals Private Limited (SVEPL), a company incorporated under the Companies Act, 2013, having its registered office at Chennai, Tamil Nadu. SVEPL is engaged in the business of specialize in projects planning and appraisal; design and detailed engineering; and supervision of construction and erection and brings significant industry expertise and practical experience.

1.3 Both parties, hereinafter collectively referred to as "the Parties" and individually as "a Party", share a common interest in fostering industry-academia collaboration for mutual benefit.

2. Purpose and Objectives

The purpose of this MoU is to establish a framework for collaboration between SMCE and SVEPL with the following objectives:

2.1 To facilitate industry-oriented training, internships, and project opportunities for students.

2.2 To promote collaborative research and development in areas of mutual interest such as electrical systems, automation, embedded systems, energy management, and related engineering fields.

2.3 To enhance the employability of students through exposure to current industry practices and skill development initiatives.

2.4 To organize joint workshops, seminars, guest lectures, and technical events.

2.5 To encourage innovation and practical problem-solving through projects and competitions.

3. Scope of Collaboration

The Parties agree to collaborate in the following areas:

3.1 Internships & Projects: SVEPL shall endeavor to provide opportunities for student internships, live projects, and industrial training in relevant domains. SMCE shall facilitate the nomination and coordination of students.

3.2 Placement Activities: SVEPL shall consider participating in the campus placement process at SMCE for the recruitment of suitable final year students. SMCE shall provide the necessary infrastructure and logistical support for placement activities.

3.3 Research & Development: The Parties may collaborate on applied research projects, consultancies, and prototyping activities. Joint publication of results is encouraged.

3.4 Curriculum Development & Guest Lectures: SVEPL may provide inputs for curriculum enrichment and depute experts for delivering guest lectures, seminars, and workshops at SMCE.

3.5 Infrastructure Sharing: SMCE may provide access to its laboratories and infrastructure for joint activities, as mutually agreed. SVEPL may provide technical expertise, case studies, or relevant software/tools for academic purposes.

3.6 Events: The Parties may co-organize technical competitions, hackathons, or career guidance sessions.

4. Roles and Responsibilities

4.1 Responsibilities of SMCE:

- a) To act as the nodal point for coordination and communication.
- b) To identify and recommend students/faculty for collaborative activities.
- c) To provide necessary academic and infrastructural support for joint programs.
- d) To encourage faculty participation in joint research and industry interaction.

4.2 Responsibilities of SVEPL:

- a) To designate a liaison officer for effective coordination.
- b) To provide details of available internship/project opportunities.
- c) To facilitate industry mentorship and on-site/remote guidance for students.
- d) To share relevant non-proprietary technical resources and industry trends.

5. Financial Arrangements

Any collaborative activity involving financial commitments shall be governed by a separate agreement or annexure to be mutually agreed upon and signed by the Parties prior to the commencement of such activity. This MoU does not, by itself, entail any financial obligation on either Party.

6. Confidentiality

Both Parties agree to treat any proprietary, commercial, or technical information disclosed during the collaboration as confidential. This obligation shall survive the termination of this MoU.

7. Intellectual Property Rights (IPR)

Intellectual Property (IP) generated from collaborative research/development will be governed by a separate IPR agreement. In the absence of a specific agreement, the IP shall be jointly owned, with details on commercialization and revenue sharing to be mutually decided.

8. Term and Termination

8.1 This MoU shall come into effect from the date of signing and shall remain valid for a period of Five (5) Years.

8.2 It may be extended for a further period by mutual written consent.

8.3 Either Party may terminate this MoU by giving a Thirty (30) days prior written notice to the other Party.

8.4 Termination shall not affect the completion of ongoing projects or obligations accrued prior to termination.

9. General Terms

9.1 Governing Law & Jurisdiction: This MoU shall be governed by the laws of India.

9.2 Non-Binding Nature: This MoU is a statement of intent and does not constitute a legally binding contract, except for clauses related to Confidentiality and Governing Law. Specific, binding agreements will be executed for individual projects/activities.

9.3 Amendments: Any amendment to this MoU must be in writing and signed by authorized representatives of both Parties.

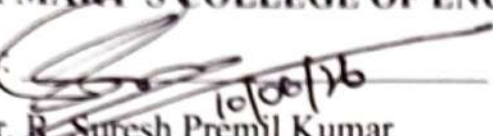
9.4 Notice: All formal communications shall be sent to the addresses mentioned in the Preamble.

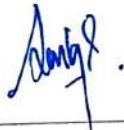
